UW Professional and Continuing Education has an outstanding opportunity for a part-time instructor within its [Certificate in Java Programming](#). The opening is for the first course in the three-course program [Object Oriented Programming in Java](#).

Classes meet on Monday evenings 6-9pm in downtown Seattle, October 8-December 17, 2018.

Requirements: A least five years of professional programming experience in Java.

- Ability to develop lesson plans and presentation materials for 30 hours of instruction. Current curriculum with supporting material exists ready to be tailored by hired instructor.
- Ability to teach the course on the scheduled weekday evening, respond to student inquiries, be available online for classwork assistance or office hours, and provide student recruiting support. Expectations during the course comprise a minimum of 3 hours of weekly instruction and at least 5 hours of preparation, student interaction, and grading outside of class time.
- Flexibility to adjust to student feedback and a willingness to teach with minimal supervision while maintaining high standards of professionalism, punctuality, and content relevance for adult students in a classroom and/or online environment.
- Ability to interact with individuals from diverse cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds.
- Excellent interpersonal, oral, and written communication skills.
- Legal authorization to work and receive compensation in the United States.

Compensation begins at \$4500 for the ten week course.
